Free eye exams for service dogs

Veterinary ophthalmologists in the United States and Canada will be giving away free eye exams to working service dogs next month.

The American College of Veterinary Ophthalmologists (ACVO) is hosting its second ACVO National Service Dog Eye Exam May 4-8, and hopes to examine 5,000 dogs this year. Active working dogs that are certified by a formal training program, or currently enrolled in a formal training program qualify for the free exam. Handicapped assistance dogs, detection dogs, police dogs, search and rescue dogs, and Delta Society-certified therapy dogs may participate.

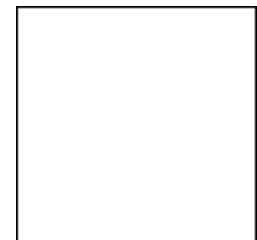
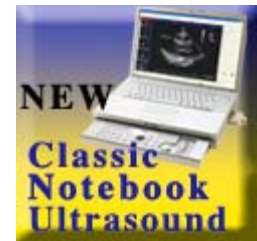
