Microwave Doggie Donuts

- 2 cups whole wheat flour
- 1 egg, lightly beaten
- 2/3 cup beef or chicken broth
- 3 tablespoons oatmeal
- 1 teaspoon garlic powder

Place flour in a bowl. Add egg and broth, mixing well. Blend in oatmeal and garlic powder. Shape dough into a ball and roll out on a lightly floured surface to 1/2 inch thick. Cut into desired shapes. Re-roll scraps and repeat. Arrange on a microwave place, wax paper or parchment paper. Microwave on HIGH for 8 - 10 minutes or until firm. Let cool until hardened.

Store in a covered container in the refrigerator.

Cheese Dog Biscuits

- 3 cups oat flour
- 1 cup grated Cheddar cheese
- 1 egg
- 2 tablespoons olive oil
- Water to moisten

In a large bowl, add all the ingredients. Mix well, form into a ball, and roll out to 1/4" thickness with a rolling pin. Cut into desired shapes, place on cookie sheets, and bake at 325 degrees for about 30 minutes or until well browned. Turn off the oven, leaving the biscuits in the oven until cooled.

These biscuits can be frozen but keep well for a couple of weeks if they are very dry and crisp. Bon Appetit!

FREE EYE EXAMS for ASSISTANCE DOGS

For the month of May, 2010, the American College of Veterinary Ophthalmologists (ACVO) is launching the 3rd annual ACVO/Merial National Assistance Dog Eye Exam Event to help serve Assistance Dogs who dedicate their lives to serving us. More than 150 board certified veterinary ophthalmologists will provide free sight-saving eye exams to thousands of Assistance Dogs.

In these exams, board certified veterinary ophthalmologists hope to identify any health issues in their early stages. They are looking for retinal disease, early cataracts, or anything that will limit their vision in the future. It's a complete ocular exam.

To qualify, dogs must be active working Assistance Dogs that were trained by a formal training program or organization or are currently enrolled in a formal training program. Owners of the dogs must FIRST register the animal via an online registration form beginning April 1, at www.ACVOeyeexam.org. REGISTRATION ENDS MAY 16, 2010. Once registered, the owner can locate a participating ophthalmologist in their area and schedule an appointment during the month of May.
